Sircle App

The school will begin trialling an app which all smart phones can connect with to display the school calendar, school notes, newsletters, messages to individuals or year groups. The cost will be \$0.00 to parents but this would allow the schools messages to be received by you quickly and efficiently. I will be meeting the representative of the company 'Sircle' this week along with executives of the P&C and Mrs Gillett so we can arrange the information used on the app to be relevant for Bringelly School.

Resource Pack.

At the beginning of the year many families paid for the resource pack which included the text books for maths (\$15.00), and handwriting, (\$12.00) the Mathletic Licence,(\$20.00) stationery such as pencils, pens, glues, and exercise books, homework books (\$45.00)and reading folders(\$7.00) for the different grades. A small amount is the general school contribution (\$20.00) which is lower than recommended at \$39.00 for each child and used for such items as paper and additional classroom supplies or art supplies(\$15.00) however most goes to the equipment your children receives in their packs. The resource pack has not been increased in 6 years although prices have crept up and built on the cost already provided from general school funds. With an whole school excursion included the total cost is \$146.00 so the resource pack is well worth the \$100.00 requested.



However, it came to my notice that senior students who were given their entire book pack at the beginning of the year to take care of, have lost or destroyed their equipment and are now asking for the school to replace pens, rubbers or rulers for them to work with. Unfortunately the school has not the financial resources to do this if the equipment supplied is not cared for. Parents will have to replace these items as required this year.

There are some families who have not enquired about financial assistance or spoken to me but still have not contributed to their children's resources at all and I would respectfully ask the families who have delayed the payments for the resources to follow up payments at the school office as soon as you can. Your support for the resources allow your child to have access to the full educational program we offer. For example they do not receive their textbooks or mathletic passwords unless they have paid and this is linked to their school and homework program. Any costs incurred by your child an invoice will be sent home.

New classroom

Mrs Keegan was very pleased to have the keys given to her for her new room. The children were very excited to have their own space. Mrs Bright and Ms Kunkler has spent a lot of time reorganising the library and preparing for the Premiers Reading Challenge. The P&C have purchased the short throw projector for 3/4K which will provide the class with an interactive whiteboard access like every other class in the school. I thank the P&C for their strong support for the school's programs.



School Camps



The year 3 / 4 students will attend an overnight camp at Teen Ranch on the 23 & 24th October . The cost will be \$160 for all activities, food and overnight accommodation. This is the third camp held at Teen Ranch and the experienced leaders provide an excellent first time camp for our students.

The senior camp this year will be to Canberra to link with the studies on democracy and science. Bankstown Coaches will be providing the transportation and with overnight accommodation at Rydges Eaglehawk, activities, food and transport the cost will be \$290 each child. The camp will be from Wednesday 9 – Friday 11 October, 2013.

Notes for both camps will be sent home shortly requiring medical forms to be sent back and with more information

about both camps.
