

QUICKSMART

Bringelly is part of a national partnership with the Federal Government and the NSW Department of Education and Communities to increase the mathematical knowledge in students and increase their ability in this important area.

All Year 3-6 teachers and Mrs McCabe, Learning Support Officer, have attended two days of numeracy training for Quicksmart, a recall program for basic maths facts and strategies. The learning support program for a select group of children has been functioning this year very successfully under the tutoring of Mrs McCabe . The Quicksmart strategies are taught in the classrooms by all the teachers and evaluation has shown the students have increased their recall and understanding of maths facts. Great effort by students and teachers.

TRANSITION TO START SCHOOL

Each year at Bringelly we have run an in-depth transition program. If you have a child who will begin school in 2015 please enrol them NOW. We will be sending out information about our transition program near the end of the term. We are planning a program which will run on a Friday or Monday for 4 weeks. Parents also take part as they learn about the school program for Kindergarten students and how to best prepare your child to enter school. For families with children under 5 there will be child care available, so you can sit and listen without being disturbed and have a pleasant morning tea to get to know the other new parents.

SECURITY

Thank you to every community members who keep an eye on the school in after- school hours. The advice from police and school security was to inform you via our facebook page and app when we had a break-in two weeks ago. The heightened alertness of everyone will mean the school will be safer and more secure.

Grandma was attacking Red Bull with rainbow power. Finally she beat him because he was getting so weak. I am really glad my grandma was a super hero.



WHAT IS PVC SUBSIDY?

PVC Subsidy is available for eligible school students, who are residents of NSW, where there is no public transport available for all or part of the journey. PVC Subsidy is paid on a daily basis between home and the

transport pick up point/school. PVC Subsidy may also be available on medical or safety grounds. A special return journey must be made each morning and afternoon.

ROLE OF PARENTS

Sometimes it's hard to know if your child is really coming down with something or just suffering a bout of Mondayitis.

For safety's sake, if your child seems unwell you should always keep them home from school and seek medical advice.

However, if they miraculously recover by 11.00am and seem ready to race around the backyard, keeping them in bed all day may send a message, that staying home isn't nearly as much fun as going to school.
